## **Professional Development & Events Committee**

The PD & Events Committee acts as a quality assurance committee for the Professional Development Program and assists in the planning of the MTAM Spring Conference as well as other events we host throughout the vear.

On their own or in conjunction with other committees they:

- Implement, review, and develop the policies governing the program
- Provide education opportunities within the guidelines of the program
- Approve education and continuing competency activities for education credits within the guidelines of the program



- Oversee the MTAM Scholarship program
- Provide peer review as required
- Provide feedback on course and presenter selection and conference format
- Assist in venue selection
- Provide on-site assistance at conference and other events to enhance participants' course experience

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## **Inclusive Practice Committee**

The Inclusive Practice Committee works to address the concept of inclusive practice and reducing barriers that may prevent some individuals from reasonably accessing massage therapy care or which may affect members' ability to access MTAM information, events, and other benefits. They:

- Identify MTAM content, resources, documents that should be updated to reflect inclusive language and/or include appropriate accessibility features.
- Identify and/or create resources and education opportunities that will assist MTAM members in
  - ounderstanding the concepts of accessibility and accessible practice
  - o how to improve accessibility to massage therapy in their practices
  - o how to identify and remove potential barriers to clients considering massage therapy care
  - ohow to identify and remove potential barriers for RMTs working in their clinic

#### **Regional Initiatives Committee**

The Regional Initiatives Committee works to uncover and discuss concerns and issues that may be unique to each health region and the MTAM members who live/work there. They:

- Oversee the new Community-Based Network program that will help MTAM better meet the needs of regional members.

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## **Marketing & Communications Committee**

The Marketing & Communications Committee helps support MTAM's communications and marketing efforts toward MTAM members, prospective members, and the public. They:

- Assist in the development of clinic and practice marketing tools and resources for MTAM members to use to educate clients and promote the efficacy of massage therapy.
- Contribute to the educational message that MTAM provides to the public via print, radio, television, and social media.
- Promote to the public the benefits of massage therapy as provided by MTAM members.
- Promote the benefits of MTAM membership to MTAM members and prospective members
- Contribute to the marketing strategy of Massage Therapy Awareness Week
- Assist in the communication to MTAM members through MTAM website, social media, monthly newsletter, and emails.

## **Insurance & Practice Management Committee**

This committee coordinates insurance-related matters on behalf of the Board of Directors and members of the Association, as well as provides general stewardship and oversight of all massage therapy practice management policy, best practices, and national standards. They:

- Regularly survey MTAM members concerning their business and professional insurance matters.
- Provide information and resources to members regarding insurance matters.



- Identify, assess, and create programs for members to better-manage their risk (Privacy Laws, Health Information Act, Business & Legal Agreements, etc.)
- Review the member Professional Liability and General Insurance program on an annual basis and make recommendations to the Board of Directors concerning renewal.
- Monitor and review the activities of all third-party insurers providing coverage of Massage Therapy within employee benefit plans.
- Develop and maintain a liaison strategy with third party insurers, WCB, and MPI to advocate for our member's inclusion in their policies.

## **Research Committee**

The Research Committee provides education, inspiration, and guidance to all MTAM members and massage therapy students who wish to engage with and understand research relating to the profession of Massage Therapy. Their activities include:

- Identify and review relevant Massage Therapy research and other projects and share research information with MTAM members and the public through the MTAM website, e-newsletter and/or other communication methods.
- Network/liaise with credible research organizations focused on Massage Therapy and related health topics.
- Advocate for research that would provide Massage Therapists with an evidence base to support best practices.
- Facilitate the participation of MTAM members and massage therapy students in Massage Therapy research studies conducted by credible research organizations.
- Fund research projects relevant to the massage therapy profession as budget permits.
- With the Education & Continuing Competency Committee, monitor and maintain the MTAM Resource Centre for member access.
